Emily Cay Bjurqvist is an International Law Fellow at IntLaw Consortium. She graduated from Leiden University with an Advanced LL.M. in European & International Human Rights, where she was awarded an A for her thesis on *Social Media Platform's Accountability in Removing and Hindering the Dissemination of Deepfake Child Sexual Abuse Material Generated by AI*. She also holds a Senior LL.B. from Queen Mary University and a B.A. in Human Rights & Sociology from Kingston University.

Emily's expertise is centered on European human rights law, having contributed with Amnesty International Norway as a translator, campaign author and research officer, writing an extensive report on youth's freedom of speech which laid the ground for a multi-year project. She also regularly conducts seminars at Norwegian high schools on international human rights law. Furthermore, Emily competed in the *Helga Pedersen Moot Court Competition* and advanced her team to the final rounds before the European Court of Human Rights in Strasbourg,
