Ignacio has significant litigation experience in Argentina, where he spent over five years developing legal strategies, advocating in court, and working on complex human rights cases. He later worked with the French NGO *Forum Réfugiés*, where he provided legal and administrative support to asylum seekers before the *Office français de protection des réfugiés et apatrides (OFPRA)* and the *Cour nationale du droit d'asile (CNDA)*, while also assisting with access to essential services such as housing, healthcare, and education.

His work includes strategic support in public international law and human rights litigation, advanced legal research, and international regulatory analysis.
