Kayleen van Rensburg is an International Law Fellow at IntLaw Consortium. She holds an LL.M. in Public International Law from Utrecht University, where her thesis centered on *Reconciling the Right to Development and Indigenous Land Rights in International and African Human Rights Law*, analyzing Kenya's Indigenous Ogiek.

Kayleen's interests lie at the intersection of public international law and human rights. Prior to joining IntLaw, she developed advocacy, drafting and negotiation abilities through structured training settings, including a simulated periodic review of the Gabonese Republic before the *United Nations Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination*, where she contributed to drafting and reviewing deliverables. She has also been active in the Model United Nations for nearly a decade, which has strengthened her public speaking and policy analysis skillset.

At IntLaw, Kayleen works across diverse public international law and human rights law matters. Her portfolio includes collaborating in drafting written submissions for States in international and regional proceedings, preparing legal memoranda and reports for clients, assisting with hearing preparation, and developing materials for capacity-building workshops and events hosted by IntLaw.
